WHEREAS, the National Economic and Development Authority (NEDA) launched "AmBisyon Natin 2040" which envisions Filipinos to enjoy a shingly deeply rooted comfortable and secure life in all aspects by 2040'

WHEREAS, the Philippine Development Plan (PDP) 2017-2022 intends to accelerate all infrastructure development projects, including the energy sector;

WHEREAS, the Philippine Energy Plan (PEP) 2018 - 2040 seeks to unify with government partners and the private sector to meet the country's electricity and fuel requirements through improvements in the energy market simplification of government procedures, promotion of resiliency in energy systems and infrastructures, and the enhancements of the consumers' power of choice

WHEREAS, the Philippine Power Development Plan 2017-2040 forecasts that the country will need 49,287 megawatts (MW) additional capacity by 2040. With an average annual growth rate of 5%, power demand will continue to move in an upward

WHEREAS, the Congress of the Philippines passed Republic Act No. 11032, otherwise known as the "Ease of Doing Business and Efficient Government Service Delivery (EODB) Act of 2018" and Republic Act 11234, otherwise known as the "Energy Virtual One-Stop Shop (EVOSS) Act that seek to establish the inter-operability of government processes through an online system that streamlines the permitting processes of power generation, transmission, and distribution projects;












# Partnership with USAID-ESP

#### EXECUTIVE ORDER No. 06 Series of 2023

#### PROVIDING FOR THE CREATION OF THE ENERGY SECTOR COMMITTEE, PURSUANT TO CITY ORDINANCE NO. 2021-296, ITS COMPOSITION AND FUNCTIONS

WHEREAS, Section 2 of Republic Act No. 11285, otherwise known as the "Energy Efficiency and Conservation Act," provides that "(I)t is the policy of the state to institutionalize energy efficiency and conservation as national way of life geared towards efficient and judicious utilization of energy by formulating, developing, and implementing energy efficiency and conservation plans and programs to secure sufficiency and stability of energy supply in the country to cushion the impact of high prices of imported fuels to local markets and protect the environment in support of the economic and social development goals of the country."

WHEREAS, the Inter-Agency Energy Efficiency and Conservation Committee (IAEECC) issued Resolution No. 01, Series of 2020, directing all government agencies, including Local Government Units (ICBU) and Foreign Service Posts, to comply with the Government Energy Management Program (FSME)

WHEREAS, the Department of the Interior and Local Government (DILG) and the Department of Energy (DOE) issued Joint Memorandum Circular No. 2020-01, dated April 30, 2020, laying down the guidelines for the LGUs to facilitate the implementation of energy projects and requiring them to activate their respective Energy Sector Committees:

WHEREAS, the City Government of Muntinlupa issued Executive Order No. 18, Series of 2020, providing for the creation of the Energy Efficiency and Conservation Office (EECO) under the City Planning and Development Office (CPOD):

WHEREAS, City Ordinance No. 2021-296, otherwise known as the Local Energy Code of the City of Muntinlupa, requires an Energy Sector Committee to facilitate the implementation of energy projects, in accordance with the existing relevant energy and other regulatory laws, and issuances:

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Rozzano Rufino B. Biazon, City Mayor of Muntinlupa, by virtue of the powers vested in me by law do hereby order and decree that:

RESOLUTION No. 3

#### A RESOLUTION RECOMMENDING MEASURES TO REDUCE FUEL CONSUMPTION IN THE CITY GOVERNMENT OF MUNTINLUPA

WHEREAS, Republic Act 11281, otherwise known as the "Energy Efficiency and Conservation Act", mandates all Local Government Units to formulate, develop, and implement their own Local Energy Efficiency and Conservation Plan (LEECP) to ensure sufficiency and stability of energy supply in their jurisdiction in support of their local economic and social development goals;

WHEREAS, City Ordinance No. 2021-296 adopted the Local Energy Code of Muntinlupa City to promote energy efficiency and conservation, facilitate the implementation of energy project harmonize local and national policies of energy utilization, efficiency, safety, resilience and development, and for such other related purposes;

WHEREAS, there has been a persistent increase in fuel prices in the country in the recent months, brought about by numerous external factors, affecting all sectors of the economy, both public and

WHEREAS, there is a need to control and monitor the expenditures of the City Government of Muntinlupa with regard to fuel consumption amidst the rising oil prices and limited budget of the City Government for the said purpose;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, AS IT IS HEREBY RESOLVED by the Local Finance Committee, to recommend that requests from Muntinlupa constituents for free use of the city buses, flexi trucks, coasters and other vehicles for the purpose of leisure and relaxation, be granted, provided that they will shoulder the gasoline expenses. This is without prejudice to other relevant austerity measures the City Government may adopt to conserve and reduce fuel consumption in the City.




